MORE ON THE ORION PIPELINE

On June 23, 2017, Tony Capitano, and Paul Ranello met with David Kinney Mid-Atlantic Policy Director Trout Unlimited. We discussed two main topics; the need to obtain the Lake Wallenpaupack relicensing settlement Agreement, and the Orion Pipeline crossing the Lackawaxen River. On August 11, Mr. Kinney, thru the freedom of Information act, was able to obtain an original copy of the FERC Project 487 Lake Wallenpaupack Relicensing Settlement Agreement. This Agreement dated May 19, 2004 was sent to PWTU as an attachment. Mr. Kinney sent a link <https://elibrary.ferc.gov/IDMWS/search/results.asp> as one way to monitor the progress on the Orion pipeline.

Update: According to the Pike County Conservation District, the port-a-dam system used to cross the river has been unsuccessful, and has been removed from the river. The new crossing includes a horizontal bore under the river. Many thanks to Mr. Kinney for his assistance in these matters.

WAYNE POPPICH PRESENTATION “NIGHT FISHING FOR TROUT”

One of our more knowledgeable and long-time members, Wayne Poppich, gave a presentation on Night fishing for trout back in April 2017.

Wayne gave us a whole host of great tips some of which are presented here for your own edification.

1. Bigger trout come out at night.
2. They can detect your movement in the dark.
3. Trout are more sensitive at dawn or pre-dawn to color; they can distinguish color or shades of black and white.
4. The famous Joe Humphries said any color is good as long as it is black.
5. Two different wet flies about 25” apart are favored for night fishing.
6. It pays to do daylight scouting and memorize the pool.
7. Behavioral Drift-different insects at night time go into a mass and move to a different part of the stream
8. Scent-washing your hands with mud takes your scent away.
